## **Infant Crisis Services BabyMobile in Perry on Feb. 17th**

*Free formula and diaper distribution returns to Noble County*

OKLAHOMA CITY, January 28, 2025 -- The Infant Crisis Services BabyMobile, a mobile formula and diaper pantry, will visit Noble County YMCA in Perry on February 17th.

The BabyMobile will be in the YMCA parking lot at 107 N 7th St. from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. to serve clients first come, first served on a drive-thru basis. Children younger than four are eligible. The adult present should be the parent or legal guardian but does not have to bring the baby.

Infant Crisis Services provides this assistance a maximum of four times per calendar year for each child. Visits must be at least a week apart. Visits to the organization's office in Oklahoma City and to the BabyMobile count toward the four visits.

The BabyMobile comes to Perry the third Monday of each month. The schedule may change due to adverse weather conditions. For the current schedule and updates, families can call 405-528-3663.

Infant Crisis Services developed the unique BabyMobile service to break down the transportation barrier that prevents many families from receiving assistance. "Many families in Oklahoma lack resources for their babies, and the transportation to get where they need to go, and we hope to eliminate that barrier with the BabyMobile program," said Yara Gutierrez, Manager of BabyMobile Services.

Infant Crisis Services, a 501(c) (3) nonprofit organization, provides life-sustaining food, formula, and diapers to babies and toddlers in times of crisis because no baby should go hungry.
